## What Does the Bible Say?

Questions arise in practically every situation of life. Those who wish to know and understand will inquire of those who appear to have the answers. Christians should expect questions regarding our faith, and we are instructed to be prepared with proper responses to those questions (1 Pet 3:15). The best responses to questions regarding our faith always reference what the Bible says regarding the issue.


Too often our response to a question will begin with "I think" or "I believe." The problem with this type of response is that not only is it not authoritative, but it appears to be just an opinion. Opinions regarding religious matters are numerous and varied, and they lead to disagreements rather than solutions. When seeking answers, we need to consult the authority. In spiritual matters, the Bible is our authority.

The apostle Paul, in **Romans 4**, uses Abraham to establish justification by grace and faith. In the midst of the discussion, he asks the question, "For what saith the Scripture?" Paul, inspired of the Holy Spirit which Jesus said would guide the apostles into all truth, did not authoritatively argue his point through inspiration alone, but rather used Scripture to

provide validity. This is not an isolated incident, but rather an example of how to teach with authority, using the Scriptures as the authority. Likewise, Jesus referred to the Scriptures as the authority when He said, "...Ye do err, not knowing the Scriptures. . ." (Matt. 22:29), and "Search the Scriptures, for in them ye think ye have eternal life; and they are they which testify of me" (Jn. 5:39). If Jesus used the Scriptures in proving His points, should we not follow His example?

"What does the Bible say?" is the most appropriate response to questions regarding our faith and practice that we can provide to those who lack understanding. May we be diligent in our Bible study so we can be prepared with that answer.
