Speech - A Blessing or a Blight? -Mike Winkler

It has been said, "Wise men talk because they have something to say, fools because they have to say something." Speech is a gift God bestowed only to man. Consequently, we are reminded, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue..." (Proverbs 18:21). Mankind was also given the power of choice; accordingly, we are taced everyday with the choice of how we will use the precious gift of speech. Will we employ it in a positive way, thereby producing "life," or in a negative way, causing "death"? In his Proverbs, Soloman suggest several positive things we need to consider as we use the worderful gift of speech. (1) Think before speaking - Proverbs 10:19; 3:3; 15:28; and 21:3. (2) Always maintain confidentiality - Proverbs 11:12-13. (3) Always tell the truth - Proverbs 12:17, 14:5, 25; and 28:23. (4) Remember timing is everything - Proverbs 15:23; 25:11. (5) The tone and volume of our voice is important - Proverbs 15:1; 27:4. (9) Always listen before responding - Proverbs 18:13. (7) Strive to be kind and encouraging - Proverbs 12:18; 16:21, 24; 20:30; 20:11; 31:26.

We are admonished to be "quick to hear and slow to speak" (James 1:19) - Why? - "Death and life are in the power of the tangue." (Proverbs 18:21).
