Would you believe the answer is, "Attend church"? Now, I know what you are saying, "Preachers will do anything to get people to come to church." Right? Wrong! This information came from the *International Journal of Cardiology*.

In the little paper, *Bottom Line* (February 15, 1987), the following article appeared: "Religious faith wards off heart attacks. Recent discovery: Nonreligious people have a heart attack risk two and a half times higher than that of religious people-regardless of serum cholesterol or blood pressure levels."

How could that be? I am not a doctor but I have a few ideas. Christians Do Not Have To Live With Guilt. As a child of God I can know that the blood of Jesus continues to keep me pure every day (1 John 1:7). Even though I foul up, I can live with confidence knowing I am safe in the arms of my Lord. I am free to enjoy forgiveness.

Christians Are A Part Of A Loving Family-The Church. In a day when families are being shattered by divorce, alcoholism, and death, I have something that remains the same. My family, the church, remains to help me make it through the worst of times. Redwood trees have been able to survive the centuries because their roots interlock with others.
