Until his death a few years ago, C.E. McGaughey was loved and respected throughout the entire brotherhood. He was one of my favorite preachers. He loved the word of God and knew how to preach it effectively in love and simplicity.

Someone told me that once while speaking on a lectureship in Texas, brother McGaughey said that the solution to every problem in a local congregation is evangelism. To a great degree, I am persuaded that he was right.

With few exceptions, all congregations face the same problems-poor attendance, poor giving, poor interest, lack of enthusiasm, lack of real commitment, many dropouts, loss of many young people and only a few conversions each year.

But can you imagine the change if every member of every congregation should become vitally concerned with the salvation of lost souls and determined to do something about it? What would happen if a large number of the members came to the elders and assured them of their fullest support in trying to reach the lost in both the local community and throughout the world?

Can you imagine the interest and enthusiasm in Bible classes and worship if all Christians really became involved in trying to lead others to the Lord? Do you think prayer would be a formality? Do you think the preaching of God's word would be dull and meaningless? Can you imagine a large group coming together to pray for strength and wisdom in reaching the lost in the local community? Can you imagine a business meeting when the only item discussed is how to reach the lost with the gospel effectively?

Is this not what God wants us to be doing? Should not this be our top priority? Can we truthfully claim to be the church of the New Testament until we make evangelism the very heart and center or our lives?

SOME THINGS I DID NOT KNOW

As an Arkansas legislative committee gathers to consider allowing the sell of liquor in restaurants and hotels in all dry counties in our state, I have gone back and been doing some reading concerning the use of alcohol among citizens in our nation. My research causes me to see some things I had not considered.

- 1. Alcohol is a business that conservative estimates say is a forty billion dollar business in our country.
- 2. Over one billion dollars is spent on advertising this deadly brew.
- 3. Estimates vary among reports, but everyone agrees that better than fifty percent of all teenagers drink alcoholic beverages.
- 4. One of every four teenage drinkers is a problem drinker or alcoholic.
- 5. More than five percent of America's work force are alcoholics and another five percent are alcohol abusers and problem drinkers.
- 6. Of about 50,000 lives lost each year in traffic accidents more than half are alcohol related-about 28,000.
- 7. For every one dollar raised in tax revenue in this country, more than four dollars is lost in alcohol related expenses such as lost production, health and medical care, motor vehicle accidents, violent crimes, and fire loses.
- 8. Two of every three murders in this nation are committed when the perpetrator has at least a 0.10% blood alcohol level.
- 9. Although alcohol is not given as a primary diagnosis for persons admitted to hospitals the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism found that \$1.00 of every \$5.00 spent on medical care is due to alcohol related problems.
- 10. The suicide rate for alcoholics is 58% greater than for non-drinkers.
- 11. Alcoholics are 7 times more likely to be divorced or separated.
- 12. The children of alcoholics are twice as likely to become alcoholics as the children of non-alcoholics.
- 13. Sixty percent of all child abuse cases involve alcohol.
- 14. Alcohol is the number one cause of preventable birth defects.

One thing I did know, alcohol is the number one drug abused in this country. All drug abuse is a problem, but this is the most dangerous and deadly to our nation and all her citizens.

Opposing Team Helps Handicapped Player Score

Jake Porter was born with chromosomal fragile-X syndrome, a common cause of mental retardation. Jake couldn't read. He could barely write his name. But Jake loved football, and the 17-year-old faithfully attended every practice at his school, Northwest High in McDermott, Ohio.

Jake's coach Dave Frantz wanted to do something special for Jake. So before a game against Waverly High in the fall of 2002, Frantz called his friend Derek Dewitt, the head coach of Waverly. Frantz suggested that both teams allow Jake to run one play at the end of the game, assuming the game wasn't on the line. Jake would get the ball and take a knee, and the game would end. Dewitt agreed.

So, with Waverly leading 42-0 and five seconds left in the game, Frantz called a timeout. Jake trotted out to the huddle, and the two coaches met at midfield. *Sports Illustrated's* Rick Reilly picks up the story:

Fans could see there was a disagreement. Dewitt was shaking his head and swinging his arms. After a ref stepped in, play resumed and Jake got the ball. He started to genuflect, and he'd practiced all week. Teammates stopped him and told him to run, but Jake started going in the wrong direction. The back judge rerouted him toward the line of scrimmage.

Suddenly, the Waverly defense parted like peasants for the king and urged him to go on his grinning sprint to the end zone. Imagine having 21 teammates on the field. In the stands mothers cried and fathers roared. Players on both sidelines held their helmets to the sky and whooped.

Apparently when the coaches met before the big play, (Jake's coach) Frantz had reminded Dewitt of the plan, that Jake would simply take a knee. But Dewitt wasn't satisfied. He said, "No, I want him to score." Dewitt called his defense over and said, "They're going to give the ball to number 45. Do not touch him! Open up a hole and let him score! Understand!"

Jake had the run of his life, all because of Dewitt's unselfish decision: "I want him to score."

There is a lesson in there somewhere for Christians. Didn't Jesus say, "Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others. Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 2:4-5).
