The Value of Companionship

"Two are better than one because they have a good return for their labor..." -Ecc. 4:9

It has been noted frequently that close human relationships, such as that which is characteristic of the family, provide a person with many advantages in life. In Ecclesiastes 4:8-12, Solomon provides illustrations of this principle which are most vivid.

An analysis of this text reveals several life-situations in which companionship can be an advantage.

- (1) Companionship may be beneficial in business. Friends can share the labor and the reward. It is infinitely more gratifying to labor for the benefit of those one loves, rather than for self alone. There is nothing more pathetic than the lonely miser. Howard Hughes was a prime example of such. He died a billionaire but with scarcely a friend in the world a lonely, pathetic recluse.
- (2) Friends can help one another in times of dire need. How tragic is the circumstance when one becomes ill and there is no one to provide sustenance and care. Countless lives have been saved by the proximity of friends in times of tragedy.
- (3) Companions can find comfort in one another. Verse 11 likely contemplates travel during those chilling Palestinian nights. Companions share body heat by huddling together. The implied bone-cold misery of the lonely sojourner stands in stark contrast.
- (4) Companionship also affords protection in times of danger. Two companions are much more of a deterrent to violence than is the lone potential victim.

Let us acknowledge the value of godly human relationships and cultivate rich friendships. Family members need to be friends (a strange observation to make!) And Christians should be friends to one another.

Jacob Ditzler and J.S. Sweeney (a Gospel preacher) were having a debate on the subject of the scriptural mode of baptism. Ditzler showed that a secondary meaning (per modern definition) of the word "baptize" was "to sprinkle."

In reply, brother Sweeney showed a secondary meaning of "believe" (per modern definition) was "to

have an opinion," and the secondary meaning of "saved" (per modern definition) was "to be pickled."

He then gave the resulting translation of Mark 16:16: "He that hath an opinion and is sprinkled shall be pickled." Then he raised the valid question, "Is it our aim to see what we can make of the Scriptures, or is it to find out what God has said?
