A DECISION FOR ETERNITY

Ordis Copeland, Sr., started preaching in 1938. At 84, he still preaches two or three times a month in the Little Rock area.

Dad tells a story about trying out for the University of Arkansas basketball team that always intrigued me. His younger brother Jady had managed to go to the University of Arkansas on a basketball scholarship. Jady had done well and told the coach about his older brother. Dad had become a good player in the two years at Harding before they suspended the basketball program due to the start of W.W.II. Two years of eligibility remained. The University of Arkansas' big rebounder had graduated the year before. So the coach sent Dad and Mom bus tickets to come for a tryout.

Dad said he had one of those once-in-alifetime tryouts. Everything he did was right. He hardly missed a shot all day and he finished the two-hour workout by hitting over fifty straight free throws. The coach offered him a full scholarship. The remainder of his education would be paid. The coach even promised to find Mother a job so they could put money aside for a family after graduation.

The dream he had envisioned on the dirt courts of Pike County, Arkansas had come true. The fact that this was no ordinary team made it even more tempting. Two years later the team played in the final four of the national tournament.

Several years ago I saw the display of that final four team in the Bud Walton Arena on the University of Arkansas campus, my Uncle Jad's picture among them. My dad's picture was not there. He and Mom decided to return to Harding, so he could study to be a more effective preacher. He said, "We made a decision for eternity that day." There have been no regrets.

I like to think if my dad had played on that team, they might have won that national championship. But I am so proud of the choice he made. I often encounter people who tell about the difference Ordis Copeland made in their spiritual lives. Dad's decision still makes my heart swell.

America's three-decade experiment with fatherlessness has failed. 23,000,000 children will be sleeping in fatherless homes tonight. The divorce rate tripled since 1960. Illegitimacy has followed a geometric progression from 10.7% in 1970 to 33% today. 40% of children in fatherless homes have not seen their fathers for more than one year. 58% have never been in their father's home. Mother-headed homes have grown from 6% in 1950 to 24% today. Single-mother families are five times more likely to be poor, ten times more likely to go to jail, and three times more likely to have children as teenagers. While only 24% of children come from fatherless homes: 85% of all children that exhibit behavioral disorders come from fatherless homes (Center for Disease Control). 80% of rapists motivated with displaced anger come from fatherless homes (National Principals Association Report). 70% of juveniles in state operated institutions come from fatherless homes (U.S. Dept. of Justice). 85% of all youths sitting in prisons grew up in a fatherless home (Texas Dept. of Corrections).
