

LIFE IS ALL ABOUT RELATIONSHIPS...

...AND one of the greatest gifts we can enjoy is the gift of a healthy, loving, wholesome relationship with God. Read Matt. 18. It won't take long but as you read ask yourself why are the topics of Matthew 18 strung together in the way they are? Have you ever noticed that Jesus talks about humble little children, the fate of anyone who would hurt a child, that there are some people that might be better if they plucked out their right eye and cut off their right arm, and how a man who loses 1 of 100 sheep will do everything he can to go find it? Jesus then moves to how to handle disagreements, gives a parable of a horribly judgmental, unforgiving servant, and finally wraps this discourse up with a promise that God isn't going to forgive anyone who doesn't forgive everyone who has wronged him or her from the heart. Wow, what a varied set of issues!

Matt. 18:1 starts with "At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who then is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" All of the varied topics in this chapter stem from a question from Jesus' own followers. They were concerned about where they stood in terms of their ranking in the kingdom (as maybe we are today???); statements (or thoughts) like, "I can't believe so and so did such and such...", or, "she is....", or "he isn't...." are in fact, statements of judgment and assessment of others. Statements that serve as stepping stools on the value of others and give us a false sense of value. Jesus masterfully calls a little child over to Him and tells the disciples that unless they change and become like little children, [they] would never enter the kingdom of heaven (Matt. 18:3). The humble are the greatest in the kingdom! (v.4). Make a list of the childlike qualities you possess!
