## The First Day of the Week

Questions are often raised about the regular assembly for worship: Does it matter on which day we assemble for worship? Why is Sunday designated by most religious groups as the day of worship? What is so special about the first day of the week?


Under the Law of Moses, the seventh day of the week, called sabbath, was the day set aside for rest as commanded by God. *Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God... (Exod. 20:8ff).* Thus the seventh day of the week (Saturday for us) was the day God deemed as holy for the children of Israel. The penalty for violating the sabbath was death (**Exod. 31:15, Num. 15:32ff**). However, the Law of Moses was given to only one group of people, the Israelites, and this Law was fulfilled through the life and death of Jesus Christ; it is no longer binding upon anyone. Thus, that holy day, the sabbath, is not and never has been the day of assembly for worship.

There is, however, a connection to the first day of the week for all who would worship God acceptably. All four of the gospel accounts reveal that Jesus arose from the tomb on the first day of the week (**Matt. 28:1; Mk. 16:2, 9; Luke 24:1; John 20:1**). The day of Pentecost (50 days after Passover) fell on the first day of the week. The first gospel sermon when Peter proclaimed the resurrected Jesus as Lord was preached on the first day of the week. We have both example (**Acts 20:7**) and command (**1 Cor. 16:1-2**) for assembling for worship on Sunday, the first day of the week.

It does matter that we gather for worship on the first day of the week, for it is the day which connects to the resurrection of Jesus, and is also the day on which the first century Christians regularly assembled for worship.
