*To Whom Credit Is Due*

Three times Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, is quoted in the book of Daniel regarding the God of heaven: *“Of a truth it is, that your God is a God of gods, and a Lord of lords...” (Dan. 2:47); “Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednigo, who hath sent his angel, and delivered his servants...because there is no god who can deliver after this sort” (Dan. 3:28-29); “How great are his signs! and how mighty are his wonders! his kingdom is an everlasting kingdom...” (Dan. 4:3).* Despite these thoughts, Nebuchadnezzar was warned in a dream about terrible things which would happen to him. About one year after Daniel interpreted this dream for him, he proudly took credit for his kingdom: *“Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power, and for the honor of my majesty?” (Dan. 4:28-30).* While these words were yet in his mouth, Nebuchadnezzar was brought to his knees for taking credit instead of giving it to God.

Isn't it quite possible that we, the United States of America, have pretty much done the same thing? The nation was on its knees during WWII asking God for deliverance from the world tyrants in Japan and Germany. Now we think that our goodness, our military might, our wealth, and our alliances will keep us free, while at the same time we have been removing God from our society.
