## *Add to Your Godliness Brotherly Kindness*

This is the sixth in a series of articles dealing with those characteristics that Peter taught must be diligently added to our faith if we are to be partakers of the divine nature (2 Pet. 1:1-8). We have looked at virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, and godliness; today we will examine brotherly kindness.

Brotherly kindness translates from *philadelphia*, a derivative of *philadelphos* meaning fraternal affection or brotherly love. As Christians, we are children of God, and all of God's children are our brethren. How interesting that we who have been begotten by the same Father must be instructed to have affection for each other (1 John 5:1)! *We have all obtained like precious faith (2 Pet. 1:1), and have much in common, yet the Lord saw the need for the brethren to be instructed concerning His expectation of our brotherly kindness: Seeing you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that you love one another with a pure heart fervently (1 Pet. 1:22). But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another (1 Thess. 4:9). Be ye kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another (Rom. 12:10).*

Human nature sometimes comes into play, however, and we allow pettiness to stir up our emotions, (continued next page)

preventing us from getting along with one another as we should. Knowing the nature of man, Jesus instructed His apostles, *A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one for another (John 13:34-35)*. And later in his epistles, John wrote, *Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God... If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us... If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar... And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also (1 John 4:7-21)*. Then from Paul, *And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you (Eph. 4:32)*.

Like all forms of love, brotherly kindness is something we learn: We learn it through our study of the word of God and by putting it into action in our lives. May we love one another as God and Christ love us.
