## What Will Heaven Be Like?

Imagine planning a trip to a place you have never been. You've been told about this place and it seems to be just what you're looking for. However, when you attempt to get brochures with colorful pictures, all you get is vague descriptions. Is this enough for you to plan that trip?

A trip most everyone would like to make is heaven. But do we know what it will really be like?

Consider the words of a familiar song: "We read of a place that's called heaven... how beautiful heaven must be." Think of some of the descriptions in this song: made for the pure and the free; no drooping or pining or wishing to be somewhere else; God's light shines forever there; pure waters of life there to drink and be free; rare jewels of splendor; angels sweetly singing. Words such as these are encouraging for us to want to go there. But still, do we really know what it will be like in heaven?

We can find some clues in the Scriptures. While we do not know what we will be like, we do know we will be like Him (**1 John 3:2**). We will not have a natural body but a spiritual one, and this body will be incorruptible (**1 Cor. 15: 42ff**). It will be glorious, for Paul said that the sufferings of our earthly lives are not worthy to be compared to the glory which (*continued next page*)

will be revealed in us (**Rom. 8:18**). Though John wrote much in the last two chapters of **Revelation**, the language is figurative – a bride adorned for her husband, the tabernacle of God, walls of jasper, city of pure gold, foundations of rare jewels. These figures of speech make heaven seem wonderful, but they do not provide us a literal description.

Perhaps this is addressed in **1 Corinthians 2:9** where Paul writes, *But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither hath entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.* God does not intend for us to know all the details of heaven, but He has given us enough to encourage us to want to go.

This is all I need to know: *And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes, and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain...* (**Rev. 21:4**). What about you? Don't you want to be there? It will be wonderful!
