*We Remember*

Tomorrow is our nation’s annual observance of Memorial Day. This holiday began as Decoration Day following the Civil War when a group of Union Army veterans designated a time to place flowers on the graves of the war dead. Over the years there were competing holiday traditions for the Union and the old Confederacy. These merged together in the twentieth century into Memorial Day, the day we remember and honor all Americans who died while serving in the military. For too many people, Memorial Day simply marks the end of the school year, the beginning of summer, and the Indy 500 car race, with little or no emphasis on the actual meaning of the day.


Through the centuries of time, God’s people have observed certain memorials. The Passover feast, commanded by God in memory of the sparing of the firstborn from the plague of death in Egypt (Ex. 12:14), was to be observed throughout the generations of the children of Israel. The twelve stones were erected as a memorial of the crossing over the Jordan River as the Israelites were beginning their conquest of the Promised Land. This was to be a      (continued next page)

reminder *unto the children of Israel forever* (**Josh. 4:7**). The Feast of the Tabernacles (**Lev. 23:39-43**) was a reminder to God's people that they had been dwelling in tents when He brought them out of the land of Egypt. These and other memorials were established so that the people would recall what God had done for their fathers.

There is one special memorial that Christians observe, and that is the Lord's Supper. As we have both command and example, we meet on the first day of every week (**Acts 20:7**) in remembrance of our Lord's death (**1 Cor. 11:26**), and we examine ourselves so that we may partake in a worthy manner (**1 Cor. 11:27-29**). We are to observe this memorial in reverence, spiritually minded and focused upon the death of our Lord.

As we approach this Memorial Day celebration, let us be mindful of those who have given their lives for our freedom in this country. But of far greater importance, as we observe the Lord's Supper each Sunday, let us be mindful of what His death means for all, and especially for those who submit to His will.
