## Doing It the Old-Fashioned Way

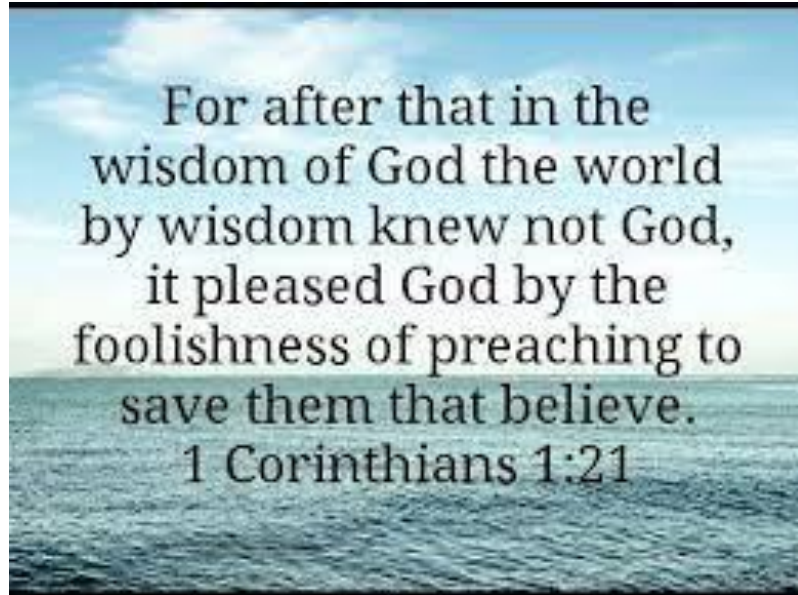

knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe (1 Cor. 1:21). The same holds true for us today; we are still saved only through the preaching of the gospel. Obedience to that gospel and living faithfully to God is the only way to heaven. There is no technology to help us with that.

The advancements in technology and healthcare have helped us in many ways in our everyday lives, but the only thing that can prepare us for heaven is the knowledge of God's word. Nothing else will do.
