
Decoration Day originated in 1868; it was a day on which the graves of soldiers who died in service were decorated with flowers. The name gradually changed to Memorial Day and, following World War II, it became an official government holiday. Not to be confused with Veteran's Day which is the official recognition of all military veterans, Memorial Day honors only those who died while serving in the military.

Not everyone observes Memorial Day in the same way. Many – perhaps most – consider it simply as one of those good ole three-day weekends with the opportunity to picnic in a park or backyard, or to recreate at the lake or golf course, or maybe even to watch war movies on TV. Hopefully we will all take the time and make the effort to remember those who fought and died for our freedom.

Christians also have a memorial to observe. While many who believe in God and Jesus observe this memorial occasionally, we follow the example of the early Christians and observe it every first day of the week (Acts 20:7). Sadly, just as those who have the wrong idea about Memorial Day, there are many who hardly give a thought to the One who died that we might live. Jesus shed His blood, the only blood worthy to remit the sins of man, that our sins might be washed away. As Paul wrote, For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come (1 Cor. 11:23-26).

Today as we observe the memorial, may we be truly thankful for what God and Jesus have done for us, giving us the opportunity to live with them in heaven for eternity.
