### No Other Gods

Seeing then that we have a great high priest...Jesus the Son of God...tempted in all ways like as we are, yet without sin (Heb. 4:14-15). This observation is based at least in part on Jesus' encounter with Satan following His baptism and forty days of fasting in the wilderness in which He was tempted in various ways. One of these temptations in particular involved the devil offering Jesus all of the glory of the kingdoms of the world if He would just bow down and worship him. Jesus' response to Satan was, Get thee hence, Satan, for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve (Matt. 4:8-10). He could have also cited words spoken by God at Mount Sinai: Thou shalt have no other gods before me (Ex. 20:3). God's desired relationship with man has always been that He would be our one and only God, and that we would be His people.

We tend to think of idolatry as involving an image made of wood, stone, or precious metal such as silver or gold, that might be used as an object of worship. But idolatry is not limited to graven images. Anything that comes between man and God is considered by Him as an idol, and that is intolerable to Him. For some, wealth is an idol – gold, silver, diamonds, and money can all interfere with one's relationship to God. Likewise, our hobbies – fishing, golf, camping, ball games, etc. – can become idols. We can devote so much of our time to participating in that which interests us that we end up not giving God our best effort and time. And when we neglect God, how do you suppose that will affect us in eternity?

May we arrange our priorities in such a way that we submit ourselves to God. Jesus said, *Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you* (Matt. 6:33). Let us follow Jesus' instructions that we may be giving God our devotion and not be distracted by our secular interests.
