## How Grace Works

The way much of the world views God's grace can be illustrated in the parent/child relationship. Many parents intervene when their children are subject to punishment. Perhaps they've gotten into trouble at school, or worse, have broken the law, and these parents want to obtain pardon for their children instead of allowing them to take the punishment due. This is a misguided example of God's grace, which is an offer of pardon but not a get-out-of-jail-free card.


On the other hand, some parents are the antithesis of grace when they behave like my dad who said, "If you are smart enough to get into the mess, you should be smart enough to get out. Don't call me to get you out." While that may be tough love, it surely does not exemplify grace. So, how does the grace of God work?

All accountable people commit sin (**Rom. 3:23**), and the punishment for sin is death (**Rom. 6:23**). Grace, being a free gift – something good which is not deserved – is God being willing to save us through faith because we cannot save ourselves (**Eph. 2:8-9**). That gift is in the form of Jesus who died for our sins (**Rom. 5:15**). This grace which brings us salvation comes with strings attached: *For the grace of God which* 

bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world (**Tit. 2:11-12**). Not a get-out-of-jail-free card with nothing expected on our part, but rather an expected acceptance of the grace through an obedient faith (**Rom 1:5; 16:26**). When we respond properly, God applies His grace through the blood of His son Jesus who died for our sins.

The gift of grace is free because there is nothing we can do to repay God for forgiving our sins. But we must obey Him in order to benefit from this gift. Let us receive the grace God has offered that we might be His children.
