## What Made Jesus Perfect?

All who truly believe in Jesus as the Son of God and the savior of the world will agree that His life was one of perfection, both in completeness and in sinlessness. Let's examine His perfection.

The most obvious indication of Jesus's perfection is that He was without sin. Most of us define perfect as sinless, and it is this trait that we most associate with Him. Jesus has become our high priest and can relate to our difficulties because He was *tempted in all ways like as we are, yet without sin* (**Heb 4:15**). It is with His blood that we are washed because He is as a *lamb without blemish and spot* (**1 Pet 1:19**). He is the One who *did no sin* (**1 Pet 2:22**).


The second aspect regarding the perfection of Jesus is seen in His accomplishments. He came to earth as a Jew under the Law of Moses. While His life here was relatively short, He did what He came to do. At His baptism, He explained to John the Baptizer that this act was to *fulfill all righteousness* (Matt 3:15). Sometime later when He was transfigured, the voice of approval came from heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased" (Matt 4:17, 17:5). One of His missions was to fulfill the Law (Matt 5:17-18). At His death, which provided the perfect

sacrifice for the sins of man, He proclaimed, "It is finished," affirming that He had fulfilled the law and all righteousness.

Finally, consider His obedience. The perfection of Jesus would not be complete without it, for He stated concerning his life that He came not to do His own will but the will of him who sent me (John 6:38). With reference to eating, He said that my meat is to do the will of Him who sent me (John 4:34). Perhaps the two most telling passages concerning His desire to obey are found in Hebrews 5:8-9 and Philippians 2:8, where it is declared that He learned obedience through the things which He suffered, and was submissive and obedient even to death on the cross.

The perfection of Jesus is not simply that He lived a life without sin, but also that He fulfilled the mission for which He was sent, and then willingly died on the cross that we might live. May we take to heart the words as we sing "Hallelujah, what a Savior!" and then follow His example of obedience to the will of the Father.
