9 Could Have Done More

Our society pushes self-promotion. When interviewing for a job, you may be asked to name and expound upon your strengths: What will you bring to this company? When vying for a promotion or simply asking for a pay raise, you may be asked to explain why you think you deserve it.

In God's eyes, however, promoting oneself is considered to be proud or boastful. The Bible tells us that *God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble* (**1 Pet. 5:5**). When we stand before Him at the judgment seat of Christ, we cannot be boastful about our accomplishments as Christians (**1 Cor. 1:29**). That would be contrary to His will.

With that in mind, how then are we to view our Christian walk? Note the words of Jesus: "So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do'" (Luke 17:10). Let's make an application to ourselves:

- We should read/study our Bibles more (2 Tim. 2:15).
- We should be more prepared for Bible class. (1 Pet. 3:15).
- We should visit/check on people more (Matt: 25:36; Jas. 1:27).
- We should talk with others about Jesus more (Mk. 16:15).

Regardless of how much we already do, we can always do more. No one has ever done more for others than Jesus who gave His life as an atonement for our sins. We can never repay that to God. We are not to promote our service as an example to others, but rather we should do more and encourage each other to do more also. And all this should be to the glory of God through His Son, and not for our own glory before men. Let us realize the need for humility and service to rule in our lives by serving God more.
